Dear Friends,

This Tuesday is called Shrove Tuesday.

It comes from the word 'shrive' which means 'absolve', so the day is intended to be as much about the admission of sins and absolution as it is about eating cooked batter delicious as it is. But we should stop calling it Pancake Tuesday.

Shrove Tuesday is marked annually as the day before Ash Wednesday. The word 'shrive' makes us realise it is an opportunity to confess to sins before the beginning of Lent. This Tuesday is also dedicated to the Holy Face of Jesus which was approved by Pope Pius XII.

It is said that this devotion brought St Therese of Lisieux, "the Little Flower", to her great sanctity. Also known as Saint Therese of the Child Jesus and the Holy Face, this is her prayer to the Holy Face:

O Jesus, who in Thy bitter Passion didst become "the most abject of men, a man of sorrows", I venerate Thy Sacred Face whereon there once did shine the beauty and sweetness of the Godhead: but now it has become for me as if it were the face of leper! Nevertheless, under disfigured features. I recognize Thy infinite Love and I am consumed with the desire to love Thee and make Thee loved by all men. The tears which well up abundantly in Thy sacred eyes appear to me as so many precious pearls that I love to gather up, in order to purchase the souls of poor sinners by means of their infinite value. O Jesus, whose adorable Face ravishes my heart, I implore Thee to fix deep within me Thy divine image and to set me on fire with Thy Love, that I may be found worthy to come to the contemplation of Thy glorious Face in Heaven. Amen.
