Dear Friends

Thank you for celebrating St Patrick's Feast with us. We look forward to spending more time with each other as we go forward as the people of St Patrick's.

From now till the Easter Vigil, our Church occupies herself with the mysteries of our salvation, in particular, Jesus' death on the Cross and His time in the tomb. When you step into the church this Sunday, you cannot help but see the Calvary, veiled with a purple cloth. What is the meaning of this? St John says, "They took up stones therefore to cast at him. But Jesus hid himself and went out of the temple." (John 8.59)

The Church calls to mind this event; for that reason, she withdraws the picture of Christ crucified from our eyes by veiling it. The cloth used is purple for penance, which signifies that Christ has put on the garment of penance in order to save us from our sins and to reconcile us with God. He has become the scapegoat, that we may participate in the grace of redemption.

The veiling of the Crucified one also indicates the profound sorrow which the Church feels for her Bridegroom, His bitter passion, and also to shock us. The lack of beauty and starvation of the senses drives us to go deeper and be less reliant on the gratification and pleasure we get from the senses. Simply nailing our hearts and our very selves to Him.

The veils over His Mother and the Saints also help us to see what the world is like without Christ and His Church. The fast gets deeper and draws us into the meditation on the Passion of Our Lord.
