Dear Friends.

The Easter season helps us to overcome our doubt in all areas of our faith. Some struggle with the total presence of our Lord in the Holy Eucharist. During the Mass, the body of Jesus Christ himself is truly eaten. The bread becomes his actual body, and the wine his actual blood. The process of this change is called transubstantiation: "By the consecration of the bread and wine there takes place a change of the whole substance of the bread into the substance of the body of Christ our Lord and of the whole substance of the wine into the substance of his blood. The holy Catholic Church has fittingly and properly called this change transubstantiation." (CCC, 1376)

But sometimes the appearance of the bread and wine change, too. Christ's true presence has been revealed over the centuries through several Eucharistic miracles.

The Eucharistic Miracle of Lanciano, located in the region of Abruzzo, is par excellence, the most well-known in the church. The miracle took place in the eighth century in a church administered by Basilian monks. Like Bolsena, one of the priests was doubting the Real Presence.

As he pronounced the consecration, the host was transformed into flesh, the wine into blood. The Body took on the form of a heart. The Blood coagulated into five irregularly shaped globules.



In 1970, the miracle was subjected to scientific scrutiny. The doctors concluded that the flesh was human heart tissue, and the blood is human. Both are from the same blood group, AB.

Today, the relics are conserved in a Franciscan church. Close access is possible thanks to a stairway immediately behind the relics. The flesh is preserved within a silver monstrance, the blood globules in a crystal chalice. Lanciano is 100 miles east of Rome.

Our Lord said to St Thomas the apostle, "you have come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed" (John 20:29).
