Dear Friends,

We are very blessed to have a replica of the Shroud of Turin on display here in the church for one more week. The visit will culminate with a talk on Monday, 4th March at 6:30pm immediately following the 5.30pm Mass


The makeup of the shroud - a herringbone twill weave - was a costly fabric for the time. The world has long been divided about whether it is a mediaeval forgery but thanks to science, it has indeed been proven to be authentic.

This Lent let us use the shroud, which is mentioned multiple times in the scriptures, as a tool to enter into a new depth of His saving Passion.

Our Lord died a harrowing death, the wealthy Joseph of Arimathea retrieved the body: "He took it down, wrapped it in fine linen, and laid it in a tomb" (*Luke 23:52*). The Sabbath was quickly approaching and, as observant Jews they had to leave, but we know that the intention was to go back, and properly clean and anoint Jesus' body with oils and spices before it was entombed.

Perhaps the biggest mystery of the shroud is what happened to the body inside of it. There are no signs of physical decomposition of Jesus' body in the image. The image then exists as a sort of "snapshot" of a corpse that was removed within 72 hours of burial.

This, along with many other factors, indicates it was the shroud of Jesus Christ. The unbroken legs, the crown of thorns, the wound in the side and the heavy scourging are all historically uncommon they are unique to our blessed Lord.



Blessed Sebastian Valfre a priest of the Turin oratory says this: "The Cross received the living Jesus, and gave Him back to us dead. The Shroud received the dead Jesus, and restored Him to us alive."
