Dear Friends.

Each April we are invited to grow in devotion to the Blessed Sacrament and to the Holy Spirit. Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday often fall in April, and when they fall in March, the Easter season continues through all of April, just like this year! In essence, April is a month of Easter, and during Easter we remember the Eucharistic sacrifice and the Baptism of Water and the Holy Spirit, which would come after Our Lord's Resurrection.

On the cross Christ really shed his blood and was really slain. In the Mass, however, there is no shedding of blood, no death; but the separate consecration of the bread and the wine symbolizes the separation of the body and blood of Christ and thus symbolizes his death upon the cross

The Mass is the renewal and perpetuation of the sacrifice of the cross in the sense that it offers Jesus anew to God and thus commemorates the sacrifice of the cross, reenacts it symbolically and mystically, applies the fruits of Christ's death upon the cross to individual human souls. All the efficacy of the Mass is derived, therefore, from the sacrifice of Calvary. It is correct to say the Bread and Wine become Jesus, not Jesus becomes bread and wine.



What we learnt from last week is that Jesus Christ is the "... only way, truth, and life" and it is in the Most Holy Eucharist that the veil between Heaven and earth is the shortest and we receive Our Lord, Most High. That intimate moment that we can not put into words as it is only the soul that speaks with such fervent love. We truly are living Our Saviour's Command: "Take and eat. This is my body" (Matthew 26:26).

J.R.R. Tolkien says, "I put before you the one great thing to love on earth: the Blessed Sacrament,"
