ST PHILIP'S DAY 2025

This evening, Sunday 25th May, we will say First Vespers and have **Benediction** at 5.30pm, followed by drinks and canapés in honour of our Holy Father St Philip.

Tomorrow, Monday 26th May, we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Glorious Patriarch, St Philip Neri, Apostle of Rome. A Solemn Mass followed by Veneration of the Relic of St Philip will take place at 5.45pm. The homilist will be Fr Richard Biggerstaff, Diocese of Arundel and Brighton.

Our resident parish artist has designed **medals of St Philip Neri** which will be available to buy for £2 after First Vespers and after the Solemn Mass.

Solemnity of The Ascension of the Lord, Thursday 29th May, is a Holy Day of Obligation. We will have three Masses, 8:15am, 12:30pm & 5:45pm (sung).

June is the Month of the Sacred Heart. The Fathers encourage you to dedicate your families in a special way to the Sacred Heart by the *Enthronement of the Sacred Heart of Jesus in Your Home.* More information will be forthcoming, speak to the fathers if you are interested.

Sanctuary Lamps can be lit in memory of a loved one, or for a particular intention. The proceeds go towards sacristy costs. The lamps burn for a week, and the minimum recommended donation is £8. Email us or use the envelopes.

Dear Friends,

Saint Philip Neri, through his friendship with St Ignatius of Loyola and like many people at time in Rome, was eager to hear about the progress of St Francis Xavier and the other Jesuits on mission in the East. This Inspired St Philip to also desire to go to India to labour in this different vineyard of the Lord, for the salvation of souls and even to shed his own blood for Christ in martyrdom.

Saint Philip never made a decision lightly, and under the guidance of a Benedictine monk, he realised that his Indies, his place of mission, was Rome. After this, St Philip, for sixty years, never left Rome again. St John Henry Newman, in giving a sermon on the 'Mission of Saint Philip Neri', explains the difference between an apostle of a country and St Philip's role as apostle of Rome. He says that an Apostle of a country is a godly person who converts pagans to Christ and His Church. St Philip's tile of *Apostle of Rome*, which he reatins to this day, explains that his mission was not to convert pagans, but to bring back the seat of Christendom, to to recover the holy faith in the practice of its people. St Philip used as his instrument of conversion, not Baptism, but Penance. St John Henry Newman said "The Confessional was the seat and seal of his peculiar Apostolate". He goes on to say, "while St. Francis Xavier baptised tens of thousands, Philip was, every day and almost every hour, for forty-five years, restoring, teaching, encouraging, and guiding penitents along the narrow way of salvation."


St Philip toiled on in his work simply, earnestly, joyously, amidst insult and opposition, gaining many souls for God. He reached out to men who had simply nothing to do, and those who could easily get lost. His own quarters quickly became too small for the amount of souls passing through it. He transferred these meetings from his own room to the church of San Girolamo. There he gave a set of spiritual exercises in a set form. We still use these at the Brothers of the Little Oratory meeting on Monday evenings. (All men are welcome to join!) The meeting, included silence and spiritual reading, teaching the faith and it was interspersed with bright and cheerful singing. All these years later in Edinburgh, this method still speaks and many men have found a spiritual home and a new patron in St Philip. Week after week, the fathers here experience people seeking confession after many years because it is readily available.

St Philip, was raised up by God to exemplify how the apostolic ministry is to be exercised by priests in a stable manner precisely where God's people live, that is, in parishes. This is the fundamental mark of what an oratory is: a place where people are simply given every opportunity to find anew, God, to love Him and to serve Him, with the mark of beauty,

friendship and sanctifying grace.
